

Yamuna River: An Archeological View

In the Sanskrit literature, the Yamuna River was portrayed as a Himalayan river of snowmelt water. The people who composed the Sanskrit literature were Greek stooges of South Bactria (Avesta) called Brahmin (DNA Z93) who were ignorant of Hindu (DNA F) history, geology, geography, and culture.

Hindus (F) were rainwater people. They lived only along perennial rainwater rivers in Peninsular India for over 60,000 years. They avoided the Himalayas and its rivers like the plague.
