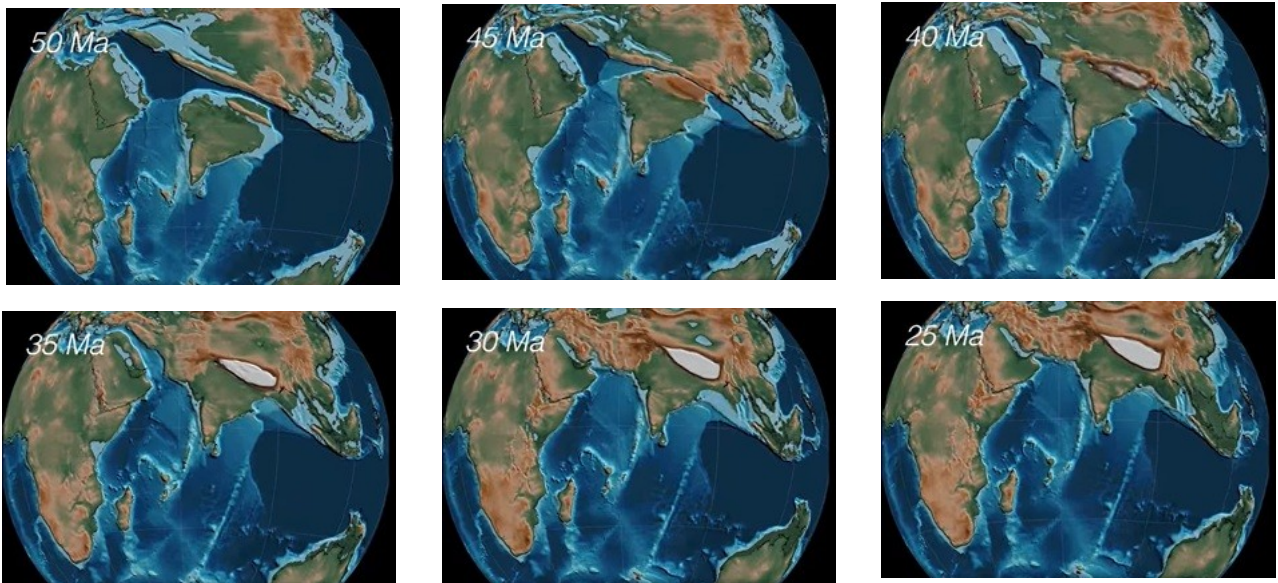


The India Plate: An Archeological View

Originally, 100 million years ago (100 Ma), the India Plate and Madagascar were a part of Africa. The India Plate drifted north and collided with the Europe Plate to form the current India. The Africa Plate also moved north. The Africa and India plates were fused again to form Balochistan. The Asian Homo Sapiens (DNA C and F) moved from Somalia on the Africa Plate to Peninsular India on the India Plate. People who lived on the Africa Plate to the west of the Red Sea were the African Homo Sapiens (DNA A and B). People who lived on the Europe Plate were the European Homo Sapiens (DNA R1).

The following maps show the history of the India Plate.



The map shows the three plates that were fused 25 million years ago. The India Plate was split into two; the west side pierced into the Europe Plate. The Asian Homo Sapiens moved to the east of the Red Sea 100,000 years ago. They lived along the lowlands of the Africa and India plates.
