

Baloch Pass, an Archeological View

The Asia Clade of Homo Sapiens, DNA C and F, voluntarily moved out of Ethiopia to Asia 100,000 years ago. They lived in the currently submerged Persian Gulf 80,000 years ago. At that time, the seawater was far below the current levels, and Balochistan and Punjab were fertile lands. Today, they are deserts.

The Asia Clade lived in Balochistan and Punjab 60,000 years ago on both sides of the Baloch Ridge. They vacated the area when the monsoon winds reversed direction and the area was reduced to wastelands 40,000 years ago.

The following map is a digital image of the landscape when Balochistan and Punjab were fertile lands. The current dry canyons in the mountains were at one time reservoirs of rainwater that fed perennial rivers on both sides of the ridge. People moved from Balochistan to Punjab along the rainwater rivers.
