The original Ramayana was composed in the Grandhika language by Hindus (DNA J2b) who lived on the west side of the Satpura Range for 20,000 years when it was fertile land. When the monsoon winds reversed direction 4,000 years ago, the J2b moved to the east side of the Satpura, to an area called Amarkantak.

Sanskrit is a recent artificial language invented by the Greek colonialists as a mixture of only the Grandhika and Avestan, a dialect of South Bactria (Avesta). The Greeks employed some delusional, unethical, and immoral Avestans called Brahmin (DNA Z93) to vandalize the Grandhika Ramayana to the Sanskrit Ramayana.
