Mundari, DNA O, lived in Peninsular India, along the Yamuna River, for over 60,000 years. They were in Punjab (Thar) 60,000 years ago when it was fertile land. They discovered the perennial rainwater river Yamuna at the top of the Aravalli ridge. They moved along the Yamuna to the Bay of Bengal. At that time, the Bay of Bengal was a giant fertile valley that stretched all the way up to Australia called the Sunda. They were in the Sunda until it was submerged by the glacial melt of 20,000 years ago. They retraced their steps and moved back to the Yamuna. They lived along the Sone River, a tributary of the Yamuna, from 20,000 BCE to 2,000 BCE. Four thousand years ago, monsoon winds reversed direction, and the fertile lands along the Sone turned into wastelands, and the wastelands to the east of the Satpura turned into fertile lands. They moved to the East Coast.
