

Gujarat State: An Archeological View

The original Gujarat was the entire west coast of India from the Persian Gulf to Mumbai that extended over 200 miles to the west of the current coastline. The seawater was 500 feet below the current levels. It was fertile land with perennial rainwater rivers that attracted the DNA F, the Asian Homo Sapiens, from Ethiopia (Africa). They had nothing to do with the African or European Homo Sapiens. They lived only along the Narmada River delta, to the south of the Indus River. They avoided the Indus like the plague because it was flood-prone, unstable, and constantly changed course.
