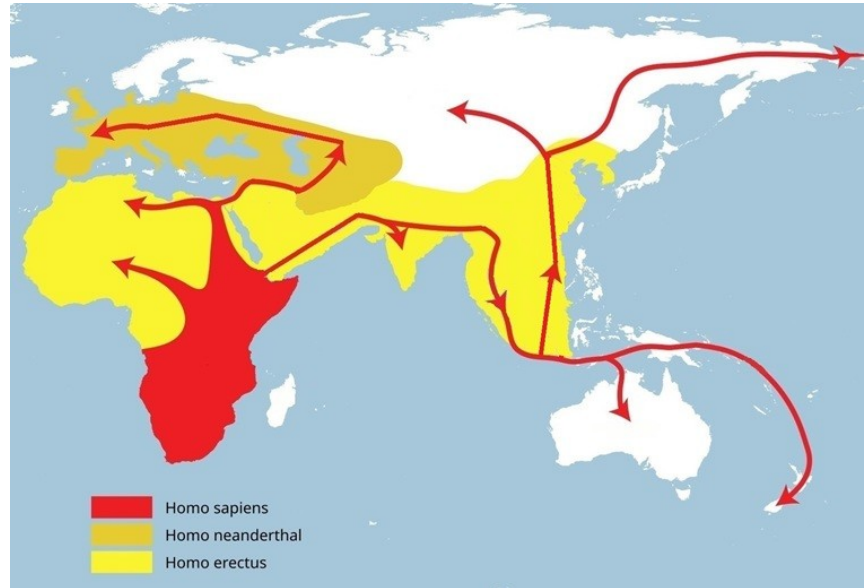


Homo Sapiens: An Archeological View

Modern humans are Homo Sapiens. They evolved 200,000 years ago in Africa. They reached Ethiopia 100,000 years ago. In Ethiopia, they were split and moved in different directions. They evolved as if they were independent species. Culturally, they had nothing in common.

The Asian Homo Sapiens were the DNA C and F. They were warm-climate people and lived only to the south of the Tropic of Cancer. They moved from Ethiopia to the Persian Gulf to Punjab to the Bay of Bengal. The C moved on to China. The F stayed in India. They were the Hindus. They had nothing to do with the current Africans or Europeans.



The European Homo Sapiens were the DNA R1. They were cold-climate people and lived only to the north of the Tropic of Cancer. They evolved from the Ice Age to the Stone Age to the Iron Age. Some of them moved south to Bactria only 4,000 years ago. Some of them moved from Bactria to the Indus River. They were the Sindhus (R1a), not Hindus (F).

The European historians were unaware of the Asian Homo Sapiens. From their perspective, human history is that of the European Homo Sapiens. They reconstructed human history from the graveyards excavated in Europe. The now lost history of the Asian Homo Sapiens is in their DNA, not graveyards.
